

RANKED CHOICE VOTING

What is Ranked Choice Voting?

Ranked choice voting is a voting method in which voters rank candidates in order of preference (1st choice, 2nd choice, 3rd choice), instead of choosing just one candidate.

Rank up to three candidates.			
Vote for one in each rank.

Why use it?

- Ranking multiple candidates allows you to still have a choice in who gets elected even if your top choice does not win.
- Candidates have to appeal to people who might initially vote for someone else.
- Ensures candidates with the broadest support win the election.
